#### • COVID-19

Leaders of the Senate Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions Committee today released for comment until Feb. 4 a <u>discussion draft</u> of bipartisan legislation to strengthen the nation's public health and medical preparedness and response systems in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic. According to a <u>committee summary</u>, the PREVENT Pandemics Act would:

- o create a bipartisan task force to review the COVID-19 response;
- require a strategic plan for the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the Senate to confirm the agency's director;
- give the Secretary of Health and Human Services additional authority to coordinate the federal response to a public health emergency, and contract with public and private entities to more rapidly develop diagnostic tests for emerging infectious diseases;
