

The Fallbrook Regional Health District received \$2,494,926.18 in revenue for fiscal year 2023-2024. Operating expenses were \$2,186,357.14, with \$759,128.99 allocated for Community Health Contracts to support local nonprofits and care providers. 

FRHD Unveils New Non-Profit: The FRHD Foundation

The Fallbrook Regional Health District Foundation received it's 501(c)3, tax exempt nonprofit status this last year. We're excited to have this option to bring more services and care to the community. Here's how the FRHD Foundation will bring about more services and care: 1) having a nonprofit foundation will allow us to seek competitive grants from private, County, State and Federal funders, 2) we can serve as the fiscal agent with smaller nonprofits to seek collaborative grants from State and Federal sources, and 3) we can accept gifts from individuals to support programming and give that donor a tax deduction for their contribution. All of these sources of funds will allow us to contract with providers and develop new programs to address local needs.

It's actually pretty common for Health Districts to have a Foundation for these types of services. In fact, our local Foundation for Senior Care was originally founded as the Health District's foundation for the hospital. When we leased the hospital to CHS (a forprofit entity), the Foundation's Board chose to spin off and offer services in the form you see today at the Foundation for Senior Care. That was nearly 25 years ago, and so we've launched the FRHD Foundation to focus on the Health District's updated strategic initiatives; Health Promotion and Disease Prevention.

This prestigious award celebrates FRHD's leadership and unwavering commitment to the health and wellness of the communities it serves. "This year's recipient is incredibly dedicated to their employees and communities. During these challenging times in health, they continue to provide unwavering support and leadership," said Cathy Martin, CEO of ACHD. "We are honored to celebrate the District's commitment to providing access to health and wellness services in their communities."

FRHD is making strides in community health with its innovative Lifestyle Change Program for Diabetes Prevention. In response to rising rates of prediabetes and obesity in the region, the District created a comprehensive, evidence-based program that focuses on sustainable lifestyle changes. Partnering with organizations like the J. Moss Foundation's Skinny Gene Project and training staff as certified Lifestyle Coaches, FRHD has ensured the program's effectiveness and accessibility for residents.

This recognition reflects FRHD's dedication to enhancing the well-being of Fallbrook, Bonsall, Rainbow, and De Luz, and their continued efforts to provide vital health services that meet the needs of the community.

FRHD's Lifestyle Change Program for Diabetes Prevention Receives High Praise

In the face of rising diabetes rates, Fallbrook Regional Health District (FRHD) has successfully launched an innovative Lifestyle Change Program for Diabetes Prevention, reaffirming its commitment to improving health outcomes for residents of Fallbrook, Bonsall, Rainbow, and De Luz. This initiative was developed in response to a comprehensive needs assessment conducted by FRHD in 2020, which identified obesity and Type 2 diabetes as significant health concerns in the region.

The district developed the Lifestyle Change Program with guidance from the J. Moss Foundation's Skinny Gene Project and offered it at the FRHD Community Health & Wellness Center, ensuring accessibility through Medicare and other insurance coverage. Its success is highlighted by Full Plus Recognition from the CDC, reflecting a commitment to high standards in diabetes prevention. Collaborating with community stakeholders, the program uses evidencebased strategies to address prediabetes and Type 2 diabetes, combining diet and physical activity support with ongoing coaching from certified Lifestyle Coaches. As a result, 50% of participants who remained in the program for at least six months achieved a 5% weight loss, significantly lowering their diabetes risk and improving overall health indicators like triglycerides, sleep quality, and mental health.

One participant shared how this program has improved their health beyond expectations: "At my last cardiologist visit, my blood panels had come back to normal range, and he asked what I was doing differently. This Lifestyle Change Program is helping me achieve my goal to stay healthy."

The FRHD Lifestyle Change Program is a model for other districts and communities striving to prevent chronic health conditions, reduce healthcare costs, and improve residents' quality of life. By emphasizing strategic funding, strong community partnerships, and evidence-based interventions, FRHD is setting a new standard for community health initiatives.











District Spotlight: Breaking Barriers -Community Resource Navigator Supports Local Residents

The Fallbrook Regional Health District (FRHD) enhances community health and wellness through essential resources, education, and preventive care for Fallbrook, Bonsall, Rainbow, and De Luz. Our Community Resource Navigator, Katia Elizondo Márquez, plays a key role by addressing economic barriers and basic needs like housing, food, and transportation. She helps residents connect with local resources and services. A great example of her impact is how she recently assisted a resident with application support.

The client was referred to Ms. Elizondo Márquez by a local organization for assistance with an application he needed to send for Housing Transition Navigation Services. The client had a harrowing backstory, having suffered two strokes, two heart attacks, and falling into a medical coma last year. Upon waking six months later, he lost everything and has been homeless since his discharge from the hospital. He had difficulty filling out the application and, despite reaching out to his medical provider and other organizations for assistance, they were unable to help him. Ms. Elizondo Márquez was unfamiliar with the form, but she reassured him that they could figure it out together. They worked on the application and sent it off, and within just 30 minutes, they received a response. By the next morning, the client was approved. Additionally, Ms. Elizondo Márquez helped him complete his social security disability application. He encountered numerous dead ends with available resources but expressed immense gratitude for the help he received. "What a great way to start the day!" he said.







District Spotlight: FRHD Celebrates First Full Year of Programming at Community Health & Wellness Center

Fallbrook Regional Health District (FRHD) is proud to announce the successful completion of its first full year of programming at the Community Health & Wellness Center, having welcomed over 12,000 visits from residents seeking health and wellness support. This year's programming made an impact with 1,237 public and club events, 120 individuals trained in Mental Health First Aid, and 1,000 support group attendees. The center also hosted 242 participants in Wellness Wednesday workshops, held 71 counseling service appointments, welcomed 300 attendees to the "Eye on Health" event, and provided meeting space for 25 local organizations.

"We're thrilled to see such strong community engagement in our first year," said Rachel Mason, CEO of FRHD. "This milestone affirms our commitment to making vital health resources and programs accessible to all residents of Fallbrook, Bonsall, Rainbow, and De Luz."

As FRHD continues to expand its services, the Community Health & Wellness Center is set to remain a vital community resource for improving health and wellness across the region.


